REGISTER FOR FREE TODAY! WHAT IS VOYENT ALERT!?

Voyent Alert! Is a multi-purpose communication service provided by the Town of Oromocto to keep you informed of critical events like fires or floods as well as day-to-day communications such as road maintenance and closures, sports facility closures, water advisories, etc.

Voyent Alert! allows you to create and follow multiple locations such as "Kids School" or "Mom's House". Any event or communication related to your followed locations will be forwarded to you along your preferred communication channel.

Smart alerting capabilities ensure that you will only get notified when a communication is relevant to your or one of the locations you are following.

The Town of Oromocto has contracted services for Animal Control/Protection Officer through the New Brunswick Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (NBSPCA). The Town encourages responsible pet ownership.

REPORTING

The NBSPCA has a uniformed Officer skilled in the provisions of providing animal control services for household pets, primarily dogs, to be dispatched within the Town or Oromocto. Services include issues such as stray dogs, unleashed dogs, dog bites and/or dangerous dogs, etc., as well as reports for animal cruelty.

PET REGISTRATION

(proof of up-to-date inoculations must be provided at the time the dog licence is purchased **ID your pet** - all dogs in the Province of NB are required by law to be registered and wear a dog tag. It is crucial for your pet to have identification so they can be returned if they get lost. Pets without identification are problematic to reunite with their owners. In these cases, the Animal Control Officer will pick up the stray animal with no tag and immediately dispatch the stray to a shelter. If a microchip is found in the pet, the owners are contacted and the fees associated with sheltering, transporting, licensing and fines must be paid prior to the release of the animal.

Council Highlights

VOYENT ALERT!

The Town launched a new notification system (VOYENT ALERT!). This multi-purpose communication service provides alerts to residents, businesses and visitors during critical events like fires or floods and provides notices for relevant day-to-day communications such as facility cancellations, weather alerts, fire bans, planned maintenance, boil water advisories etc.

Citizen Engagement

1. Subdivision and Building By-Laws - A meeting was held with the public to discuss updates to the Town's Subdivision and Building By-Laws that will apply across the Town boundaries, including the new Ward 4 - Lincoln.
2. Brand Identity and Communications Strategy - The Ginger Agency held three stakeholder meetings with residents to discuss the Town's brand identity and communications.

By-Law Reading

Banking Agreement and Credit Facility

The Town entered into an agreement with Scotiabank Visa Business Card Service.

Municipal Capital Borrowing Board - OFD Rescue Unit

The Town submitted an application to the Municipal Capital Borrowing Board in the amount of \$1,450,000 for the purpose of procuring a rescue unit for the Fire Department.

Human Resources

1. Appointment of Director of Recreation and Tourism - Jacqueline Dunn was promoted to the position of Director of Recreation and Tourism, effective 1 July.
2. Assistant Treasurer - Jassy (Xiaojun) Liu has been appointed to the position of Assistant Town Treasurer.
3. Holiday Relief Firefighter - Jean Cormier was appointed to the position of Holiday Relief Firefighter and a candidates' pool for additional Holiday Relief Firefighters will be created.

Committee Appointments

1. Town Council appointed Mr. Jeff Melanson as this year's Committee Chair. The Oromocto Pioneer Days Festival will be held from 28 June to 1 July.
2. CWO Dwayne Waller was appointed to serve as the representative for the Base Gagetown Commander on the Planning Advisory Committee.

Oromocto Health Care Recruitment Committee

The Oromocto Health Care Recruitment Committee proposal was approved by Council, subject to financial participation by the local governments of Sunbury York-South, Arcadia, Fredericton Junction, Tracy and the Capital Region Rural District.

Oromocto Business Beautification Award

Town Council provided an award in the amount of \$2,500 for the Oromocto Business Beautification Award program to be administered through the Oromocto Area Chamber of Commerce.

Millennium Award Presentation

Mr. Robin Hanson was presented the Town of Oromocto Millennium Award by Mayor and Council. This award is presented to a deserving volunteer who has made an outstanding contribution to arts & culture, community service, sports or recreation in Oromocto.

Items such as lawn rakings, leaves and other similar yard waste are to be bagged. Residents are encouraged to use compost bags where feasible. Residents of the Town of Oromocto are also welcome to drop off yard waste items to the Dept. of Engineering & Public Works at 181 Black Watch Avenue.

Spring News from the Department of Engineering and Public Works:

Tree Planting

In 2021 the Town of Oromocto started an initiative to plant 100 trees each year over the course 10 years to enhance the Town's green infrastructure. Trees are planted in selected areas of the Town between mid-April to mid-May. Types typically include (vary from availability year-to-year): maples, oaks, lilacs, service berries, flowering crab apples and other zone hardy trees. You will receive a notice if your home is in the selected part of town for green infrastructure planting this season.
