
The History

The New Brunswick Military History Museum was granted official Canadian Forces Museum status in 1973. Since that time it has grown and evolved into one of the largest museums of its kind.

Our role is to collect, preserve and promote Canada's Military Heritage.

The mission of the New Brunswick Military History Museum (NBMHM) is to collect and preserve, research and exhibit artifacts which illustrate the history and heritage of the military forces in New Brunswick, and New Brunswickers at war, during peacetime, and on United Nations/NATO duty.





Visit Us

The New Brunswick Military History Museum, located in building A-5 on the Base, contains weapons, uniforms, equipment and memorabilia as well as an outdoor collection of vehicles and artillery.

The NB Military History Museum is open year round: Monday-Friday, 9am to 4pm (September to May) 7 days a week, 9am to 4pm (June to August)

There is ample parking including accommodation for buses and R.V.'s. Access to the base and the museum is unrestricted, just follow the signs.
