Council Highlights

PAVING PROJECTS

Paving is an essential part of the Town of Oromocto's annual maintenance work for its roads and streets. These projects involve several steps of work where roads remain open, however, traffic may be impacted by the phase of work. Look for orange painted areas highlighting caution to changes in road elevations and raised manholes. Drivers are reminded to slow down and pay extra attention in these areas as to avoid any potential damage to vehicles.

OROMOCTO COMMUNITY AND WELLNESS CENTRE

The Town continues to move forward its planning for a new recreation and wellness centre. It awarded a contract to Fougere Menchendon Architecture Inc. in the amount of \$873,850, plus HST, to undertake the preparation of funding applications, a design-build request for proposals and the construction administration of the Town of Oromocto Community Recreation and Wellness Centre Project.

2023 ANNUAL REPORT

This report is prepared annually pursuant to section 105 of the Local Governance Act. The report contains general information about the Town as well as detailed information regarding Town council, the provision of grants and types and cost of services provided. BY-LAW READING

FIRE RESCUE TRUCK - TENDER AWARD

Metal Fab Ltd was awarded the tender for the replacement of the R421 Rescue Truck in the amount of \$1,237,490.31 plus HST.

HUMAN RESOURCES

1. Appointment of Mr. John Christie to the building maintenance section of the Engineering and Public Works Department.

AGREEMENTS APPROVED

- 1. The Mayor and CAO entered into a mutual aid fire services agreement with 5CDSB Gagetown; and
- 2. The annual service agreement with Indigenous Services Canada was approved for the period of 1 April 2024 to 31 March 2025.

MARINA UPGRADES (FUEL TANKS)

Council approved an expenditure of \$150,000 to supply and install a 13,000-litre capacity fuel tank at the marina.

LAND SALES

Two parcels of land were sold for future residential development in Oromocto West:

- 1. A parcel of land (3169 sq.m.), located on Terry Fox Drive was sold for a price of \$207,000, plus HST.
- 2. A parcel of land (8133 sq. m.), located on Finnamore Street was sold for a price of \$320,000, plus HST.


