Council Highlights

OROMOCTO REGIONAL WELLNESS & RECREATION CENTRE DESIGN

Council authorized the Chief Administrative Officer to engage the services of Colliers International to proceed with a request for proposals for the design phase of the Oromocto Regional Wellness and Recreation Centre.

MUNICIPAL CAPITAL BORROWING BOARD APPLICATION WATER AND SEWER UPGRADES

Council authorized the Treasurer to make application to the Municipal Capital Borrowing Board for water and sewer system upgrades in the amount of \$5 million dollars for a 30-year term.

NEW MUNICIPAL PLAN BY-LAW

Council approved the \$108,000 bid from Fathom Consulting to create a new Municipal Plan By-Law for the Town of Oromocto.

HOUSE-TO-HOUSE RECYCLING

The Chief Administrative Officer has been able to negotiate the collection of household recycling by Circular Materials, the company who has been awarded the contract by the Province of New Brunswick for implementing and managing the new extended producer responsibility recycling system. The new house-to-house service is expected to begin 1 May 2025.

PLOW TRUCK PURCHASE ENGINEERING AND PUBLIC WORKS

The Engineering and Public Works Department has been authorized to purchase a new plow truck from Bayview Truck and Transport in the amount of \$376,040.

TRACTOR PURCHASE ENGINEERING AND PUBLIC WORKS

Council approved the purchase of a Kioti tractor from Riverside Equipment in the amount of \$43,978.94 for the Engineering and Public Works Department.

PLANNING ADVISORY COMMITTEE APPOINTMENTS

Council reappointed James Grattan and Zantoon Anwar to the Planning Advisory Committee for a three-year term to expire 1 January 2028.

EXECUTIVE ASSISTANT HIRING - MAYOR/CAO/CLERK'S OFFICE

Council authorized the hiring of Cynthia Coughlan as the Executive Assistant within the Clerk's Office. Cynthia will replace long-time employee Gillian Mersereau who will be transferring to the Information Services Coordinator position effective 18 February 2025.

POLICY UPDATES

Council approved a policy update to the New Employee Orientation Policy.

SNOWPLOW DAMAGE

YARD WASTE DROP OFF

The Town of Oromocto offers a yard waste disposal drop-off location available to all Town residents (Wards 1-4). The site is located at 181 Black Watch Avenue. Please note: Plastic bags are not permitted. No commercial dumping or construction materials allowed.

TREE PLANTING

In 2021 the Town of Oromocto started an initiative to plant 100 trees each year over the course of 10 years to enhance the Town's green infrastructure. Trees are planted in selected areas of the Town commencing mid-May. Tree types include maples, oaks, ivory silk lilacs, flowering crab-apples, and lindens. You will receive a notice if your home is in the selected part of town. RECYCLING BIN LOCATION

The Town of Oromocto has Community Recycling Bin drop-off location available to all residents (Wards 1-4) located at 50 Miramichi Road (entrance off MacLaren Drive) behind the Oromocto Fire Department Station #1.

BITING INSECT CONTROL PROGRAM

The Town of Oromocto schedules an annual Biting Insect Control Program. Typically scheduled each Spring, certain patches of forest and swamps areas are treated to selectively control mosquito larvae in their aquatic habitats, before they emerge as biting adults. Larvae breeding areas are treated from the ground, while a low flying aircraft will treat from the air. As dates are weather dependent, residents can keep an eye on the Town's social media feeds for announcements.

SPRING YARD WASTE CURBSIDE CLEAN-UP

The Town of Oromocto's Spring Yard Waste Curbside Clean-Up is back! The schedule is:

- -Wards 1, 2, & 3: Items at curbside by 7AM Mon. 5 May Pickup Fri. 9 May.
- Ward 4 (Lincoln): Items at curbside by 7AM Mon. 12 May Pickup until Fri. 16 May

Compostable yard waste such as leaves, grass clippings, branches, bushes, garden refuse and other similar articles can be placed curbside for pickup. Items such as lawn rakings, leaves and other similar yard waste are to be bagged. Refuse must be in compostable bags.

Residents of the Town of Oromocto are also welcome to drop off yard waste items to the Department of Engineering & Public Works site at 181 Black Watch Avenue.



Residents must register their dogs annually, options include:


