Designated Local Historic Places

There are three properties that hold an historic significance in the Town of Oromocto that have been designated as local historic places under the Heritage Conservation Act of New Brunswick. Hazards of Feeding Wildlife in an Urban Area

The Town of Oromocto does not encourage the feeding of wildlife. This practice almost always carries with it negative consequences for the wildlife involved. There are also a number of safety and social concerns for the public, such as the potential increase in vehicle collisions, as well as damage to property and nuisance problems.

Wildlife should derive their food and shelter from natural habitats and under natural conditions. This will help maintain natural adaptations that ensure the long-term survival of the animals themselves, and of the species.

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS for MAY & JUNE 2022

Park Security Contract Awarded

Town Council authorized the Director of Recreation and Tourism to engage the security services of Triquetra Protective Services for park security starting 24 June until 4 September.

Quad NB Trailhead Improvements

The Town entered into an agreement with Quad NB for the proposed Oromocto trailhead improvements at D'Amours Street.

Restigouche Road Crosswalk/Light Installation

Council authorized the Town Engineer to repaint the crosswalk at Restigouche Road/Restigouche North Road and to install activated crosswalk lights.

Local Governance Reform Advisory Committee

Work continues with the Local Governance Reform Advisory Committee. On June 6th and June 15th an open house was held within the communities of Lincoln and Oromocto respectively to provide information on the status of the transition.

Oromocto Wastewater Treatment Plant Study

Council has authorized a study by Gemtec to look at design options for greater capacity to treat sewage to accommodate the Town's future growth needs.

2021 Audited Financial Statements

The 2021 Audited Financial Statements were approved for the fiscal year. A copy of the report will soon be available within the Town's annual report and on its website.
