Voyent Alert! is a multi-purpose communication service provided by the Town of Oromocto to keep you informed of critical events like fires or floods as well as day-to-day communications such as road maintenance and closures, sports facility closures, water advisories, etc.

Voyent Alert! allows you to create and follow multiple locations such as "Kids School" or "Mom's House". Any event or communication related to your followed locations will be forwarded to you along your preferred communication channel.

Smart alerting capabilities ensure that you will only get notified when a communication is relevant to you or one of the locations you are following.

Council Highlights

Recreation and Tourism

Trace Planning and Design presented to Council the Recreation and Tourism Master Plan which was adopted to help guide the department over the next few years.

Council approved memorial signage in memory of Ben Noseworthy, the former Recreation and Tourism Officer. Ben was a strong advocate for fair play and a group of local residents asked Council to erect signage at its recreational facilities that encourages the same. The Director will ensure the signage is placed soon.

Council received a presentation on the conceptual design for the new Oromocto Regional Wellness and Recreation Centre. It also awarded a contract for Phase 1 Preconstruction Management Services for the facility to Lindsay Construction Limited.

Employment Matters

Council authorized the creation of two new positions: Municipal Technologist and Recreation Maintenance worker.

A RCMP District Service Assistant hiring pool was created and will be effective for the next 24 months.

Two promotions occurred within the Oromocto Fire Department: Chris Bamford was promoted to Captain and Jamie Morris to Lieutenant.

Alyson Boudreau was hired as the new funding coordinator and Patrick Thompson as the Recreation Maintenance worker.

Council approved policy amendments to the Workplace Wellness, Training and Development, Fit for Duty and the Compensation for Injury policies.

Finance

The 2026 General Operating Budget (\$29 m) and Capital Budget (\$4.8 m) were approved as well as the 2026 Water and Sewerage Operating (\$5.7 m) and Capital Budget (\$687,676).

Water and Sewer Rate adjustments were approved, as per By-Law 537, effective the next billing cycle.

Teed Saunders and Doyle were appointed as the auditors for 2025 audit.

Arthur J. Gallagher Canada Limited was awarded the municipal insurance contract in the amount of \$262,893 for 2026.

Council authorized the Mayor and CAO to enter into an interim financing agreement with the Royal Bank of Canada.

Capital Renewal Funding Program Plan for the years 2026-2029 was approved by Council.

Infrastructure Updates

Council approved an expenditure for a new computerized Water Network Hydraulic Model from EXP Services in the amount of \$50,000.

Two major design projects were awarded to CBCL in the amount of \$4.1 m for all phases of design, construction administration and commissioning/closeout associated with the Water Treatment Plant and \$6.1 m for the Wastewater Treatment Plant.

Council authorized for the Town to enter into a contribution agreement with the Government of Canada relating to the infrastructure upgrades for the Residential Housing Units as follows:

Neighbourhood 1 – Contract awarded to Gemtec in the amount of \$5.3 m

Neighbourhood 2 – Contract awarded to CBCL Limited in the amount of \$4.4 m

Neighbourhood 3 – Contract awarded to EXP Services Inc in the amount of \$3.5 m.

Equipment Purchases

EPW Trackless purchase in the amount of \$176,720 from Saunders Equipment was recently approved by Council.

A plow truck chassis purchase (\$203,000) from Valley Equipment Limited and its customization and build (\$197,204) was approved by Council.

Website Upgrade

Bid received from ICS Creative Agency for the creation of a new municipal website in the amount of \$29,625.



Department of Engineering and Public Works Information

Winter Preparations:

The Town of Oromocto reminds residents that ahead of the first snowfall of the season (or no later than 1st of December), roadways are to be cleared of any items that may be obstructing travel. This largely encompasses sports equipment such as basketball and hockey nets.

Homeowners with reflective markers at the end of their driveways are also kindly asked that they are placed 1.3 meters (4 feet) from the street to ensure sufficient distance for our plow equipment to pass by.

Snow Plowing Operations: The Town of Oromocto uses a strategic, priority-based approach to snow removal for Wards 1-3. Our crews follow a planned snow-clearing route to keep the community safe and accessible. **Snow Removal Priority Order:**

- 1) Roadways – starting with major arteries and hospital routes, then collector streets, followed by residential streets and minor roads.
- 2) Sidewalks
- 3) Trails
- 4) Street widening

Parking on Town Streets:

It's that time of year where the Town reminds residents that parking vehicles on Town streets is not permitted (By-Law 502, Parking, Section 15.1). Help us keep roadways clear so that plow operators can more efficiently remove and haul snow from the streets and service areas.

Wrapping Paper:

Not all gift wrap is recyclable, so please do not place wrapping paper in your recycling bins. Plain wrapping paper is fine to recycle, but metallic or glitter-covered paper should be thrown away or saved for next year. The same goes for ribbons and string. Thank you for your cooperation.

Hazards of Feeding Wildlife in an Urban Area

The Town of Oromocto does not encourage the feeding of wildlife. This practice almost always carries with it negative consequences for the wildlife involved. There are also a number of safety and social concerns for the public, such as the potential increase in vehicle collisions, as well as damage to property and nuisance problems.

Although people who feed wildlife do so with the best of intentions and feel they are looking after the welfare of the wild animals, they should be aware that wildlife should remain wild. Wildlife should derive their food and shelter from natural habitats and under natural conditions. This will help maintain natural adaptations that ensure the long-term survival of the animals themselves, and of the species.
