Voyent Alert! A multi-purpose communication service provided by the Town of Oromocto to keep you informed of critical events like fires or floods as well as day-to-day communications such as road maintenance and closures, sports facility closures, water advisories, etc. Voyent Alert! allows you to create and follow multiple locations such as "Kids School" or "Mom's House". Any event or communication related to your followed locations will be forwarded to you along your preferred communication channel. Smart alerting capabilities ensure that you will only get notified when a communication is relevant to you or one of the locations you are following. CentreFit Pilates

Council Highlights

ORWRC

Council received a presentation of the full conceptual design of the new Oromocto Regional Wellness and Recreation Centre from MJMA/Acres Consultants. The designs were shown for each of the spaces including some interior design elements.

Active Transportation Plan and Trails Plan

Trace Planning and Design has been hired by the Town to create an Active Transportation and Trails Plan.

Communications and Tourism Officer

Lainy Dow has been hired to fill the vacant position of Communications and Tourism Officer within the Department of Recreation and Tourism.

Investment Management Policy

Council approved a new Investment Management Policy that will provide a policy guideline to document a framework for the prudent management of the Town of Oromocto's investment portfolio within an acceptable investment risk tolerance level.

Fire Service By-Laws

Council adopted two new by-laws that affect the operations of the Oromocto Fire Service. The first is a Level of Service By-Law whose purpose is to provide community fire, rescue and medical first response services; and the second is a Prevention of Fires By-Law that defines the roles and responsibilities as they relate to the prevention and extinguishing of fires within the Town. Equipment Purchases

Council approved the following equipment purchases for the Engineering and Public Works Department: Mower, One-tonne Truck and a Lift-Station Pump.

Operating Credits

Council authorized borrowings with TD Bank in the amount of \$3 million for working capital expenditures and ancillary credit instruments that enable same day electronic funds transfers (EFTs), and credit card services for point-of-sale purchases.

Town of Oromocto 70th Anniversary

It is the 70th Anniversary of the Town of Oromocto this year. A new logo has been designed to commemorate the occasion. To celebrate, Town Council will be hosting a family skate party on 29 March 2026 at the Kings Arrow Arena from 3pm to 4pm. In addition, it will also be entering a float in the annual Pioneer Days Parade held on 1 July 2026.

Spring Yard Waste Curbside Clean-Up: Get out your rakes & compostable bags! The Town of Oromocto's Spring Yard Waste Curbside Clean-Up is back! The schedule is:

- Wards 1, 2, & 3: Items must be at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on Monday May 4th. Pickup will occur anytime between May 4-8.
- Ward 4 (Lincoln): Items must be at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on Monday May 11th. Pickup will occur anytime between May 11-15.

Compostable yard waste—including leaves, grass clippings, branches, bushes, and garden refuse—may be placed curbside for pickup. Loose items such as leaves and lawn raking must be bagged in compostable bags. Residents may also drop off yard waste at the Department of Engineering and Public Works site at 181 Black Watch Avenue.

Hazards of Feeding Wildlife in an Urban Area

The Town of Oromocto does not encourage the feeding of wildlife. This practice almost always carries with it negative consequences for the wildlife involved. There are also a number of safety and social concerns for the public, such as the potential increase in vehicle collisions, as well as damage to property and nuisance problems. Although people who feed wildlife do so with the best of intentions and feel they are looking after the welfare of the wild animals, they should be aware that wildlife should remain wild. Wildlife should derive their food and shelter from natural habitats and under natural conditions. This will help maintain natural adaptations that ensure the long-term survival of the animals themselves, and of the species.
